Born on April 7, 1941 in Augusta, AR, his family moved to Detroit, MI, where he grew up. He enlisted in the USMC. After serving his country as a sea-going Marine, he began working at National Foods, eventually becoming their youngest Store Manager ever at age 20. During this time, he attended Wayne State University Night School for seven years to obtain an Associate Degree in Marketing; and also got married. Charlie was known for his guick wit, paucity of words, honesty, and friendly nature, all of which made him excel in sales work. He began his sales career with Kraft Foods and transferred to Kalamazoo, MI., where he also served as a Reserve Police Officer with the Portage P.D for seven years, and later as interim Police Chief in Schoolcraft, MI. He also began working for Campbell Sales Co. He accepted a company transfer to St. Louis, and moved to Eureka in 1976. During his years in Eureka, he worked for several food brokerages, and became active in community service with the Junior Chamber of Commerce and the Lions Club, worked on Eureka's Planning and Zoning Board, and was elected to the Eureka Fire Board of Directors, where he served for 19+ years and developed a warm bond with the whole department. He was an active member of Heritage Presbyterian Church Wildwood for the past 14 years, and had a deep faith in Jesus Christ. He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Sharon (Mitchell) Kuhn, whom he married in Detroit in April 1964, and two sons: Michael (Nora) Kuhn and Christopher (Grace) Kuhn, eight Kristy and Alex (Stephen), Adam and Natasha grandchildren: (Michael), Emma, Katherine, Alexandra, and Gwenivere (Christopher), one sister: Sue (Kuhn) Rodriguez, sisters-in-law: Janice (Jerry) Keltz, Janice (Gary)Mitchell, brothers-in-law: Roberto Rodriguez, Jerry Keltz, Gary Mitchell, Jeff Mitchell, daughters-in-law: Nancy (Stephen) Kuhn, Nora (Michael) Kuhn, and many other family members and friends. He was preceded in death by his eldest son, Stephen, and daughter-in-law, Grace (Christopher) Kuhn. A memorial service to celebrate his life will be held June 19th, 10:00 AM, at Heritage Presbyterian Church. Private interment to follow at a later date at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery.
